ONLINE PROGRAM STRUCTURE

- 42 credits
- 15-16 courses
- 6 core courses, the rest are electives
- Optional residency in New York or Israel or culminating Innovation Lab capstone experience
- Three 14-week terms per year, with two
 7-week courses taken each term
- All courses are 7 weeks in length except the capstone, which is 14 weeks in length
- The flexibility to complete program in as little as 16 months or as much as four years
- Three opportunities to start per year: August, January and May

In addition to the core program, we are currently developing plans for a Non-profit Leadership course which will explore how non-profits differ from the for-profits studied across the rest of the program, including in the Founder's Dilemmas course taught by author and Sy Syms' dean, Dr. Noam Wasserman.
